Action taken by the SIR State Board on May 11th and subsequent follow up by the branch BEC in a special meeting held on May 13th, resulted in an eblast that was sent out on May 18th to all SIR members.

There is now end in sight as the State of California and Contra Costa County are expected to remove most COVID restriction on June 15th for those who are fully vaccinated. All indoor and outdoor activities are set to start opening Hope you had a great Memorial Day! but some will take a slower approach depending on the wishes of their group chair. In any case, Bob Lucido, overall activity chair, will issue instructions and timing. Now would be a good time to sign up for some new activities. We want to try and accommodate everyone with an activity of their choice, and I might note that I am already seeing that dining opportunities are in great demand.

The next question on everyone's mind is "When are we going to start in-person luncheons?" The tentative possibility is August 2021. There are several hurdles that we need to overcome. First, is the fact that Boundary Oak needs to hire all new staff. All the servers are gone. The second obstacle is the number of people they will be able to accommodate. Policy e-Mail sent to all members 5/18/2021

To ALL Branch 146 SIR Members

On May 11st, 2021, the SIR State Board approved precautions to protect SIR (and Branches) from COVID-19 legal problems. This follows a decision by our insurer not to include coverage for pandemic diseases for any SIR sponsored function. The directive handed down to the SIR branches culminates in a document called a **Coronavirus Protocol** which each branch must follow and a **Waiver** document that each member must complete and sign to participate in all indoor or outdoor activities sponsored by SIR. This includes a separate signed **Waiver** needed for each guest speaker, visiting member from another branch, member's luncheon guest, wife, significant other, or anyone else attending a SIR event, collectively referred to as "**GUEST**".

The SIR State Board further states that for events conducted wholly or partially indoors, the branches must have each member and guest present their **Vaccination Card** or negative COVID-19 test administered within 3 days prior to an event. The branches are directed to retain a photocopy of the **Vaccination Card** along with the signed **Waiver** in its files until further notice to the contrary.

At our Branch 146 Branch Executive Committee (BEC) meeting on May 13th, we unanimously passed a motion as to how our branch would execute these new directives. According, here is list of the action items we will be following:

George Mon, our branch Membership Chairman will send via US Mail, the Waiver document to each branch member this coming week and a second copy for his wife or significant other if they are included in our branch directory. In addition, each signer will be requested to send back a copy of the <u>front side</u> of their Vaccination Card.

Additional Waiver copies will be posted on www.sir146.com website for download if needed for future "GUEST".

Once the signed **Waiver**(s) and copies of the **Vaccine Card**(s) are mailed back:

- 1. The information will be recorded in an Excel spreadsheet as a checklist for future reference. Once your **Waiver** and **Vaccine Card** information is confirmed you will not need to sign or present this information again when attending a Branch 146 activity.
- 2. Information on the spreadsheet and stored in Branch Dropbox will be available online to activity chairs so they can determine who is cleared to participate in the activity.
- 3. The signed **Waiver** and photocopies of the **Vaccine Card** will be saved and only available to the Membership Chairman as a backup.
- 4. Activities Chairs and others who might collect **Waiver**(s) and **Vaccine Card**(s) from members and "**Guest**" will submit these to the Membership Chair either by US Mail or electronically in a timely manner for recording and record keeping.
- 5. Activities Chairs will have access and can visually confirm that a vaccine card was provided but will not have access to the file copies.

New Members will get a **Waiver** form in their New Member Packet. They should send the signed copy back along with their dues.

The 2021 membership count rose to 288 which is up from If there are any changes to your contact information, April of 286.



Our next meeting is scheduled for Friday, June 19th from 9 AM to 11 AM, via Zoom Video Conferencing.


Our theme for this meeting is "Minimalism."

AREA 16 Fishing Report

Virtually, all of us are vaccinated and able to fish in any venue we choose. And the fishing (and catching) has been terrific. Nearly every one of our haunts has produced results this month.

Lets start with San Pablo Reservoir, our favorite local lake for trout. Except that trout are not the only fish in the lake. There are sturgeon there and both Ray Pixton and Carl Moyer hooked, landed, and released one of these big fish. In addition, Phil Scimonelli caught two catfish, one weighing eight pounds, casting from the shore. Not to say that trout fishing was ignored. Bob Lively (a kayak fisherman), Terry Miller, Tom Kostik, Harry Sherinian, Carl Moyer, George Vogt, Phil Scimonelli, Brion Beetz, and Ray Pixton all caught limits or near-limits on the lake.

Lakes outside of the Bay Area are also producing. Chuck Vanoncini led a group of eight fishermen that included Chuck Cornell of Branch 146 on our semi-annual pilgrimage to Lake Almanor. The group enjoyed great weather and camaraderie and, as a bonus, landed fifteen rainbows as well as five brown trout that were each in excess of five pounds. The brownies, all females, were released. We are looking forward to the second installment of Almanor fishing in October and are considering an extra trip in July, Martin Steinpress of Branch 146 caught a large black bass fishing on a private pond and, on a river outing, caught a 19 inch rainbow on a #16 midge fly. Ben LaSala caught some big bass in Amador Reservoir and limited out on rainbows in Lake Camanche. Steve Paulick heard that fishermen were nailing lots of crappie in Clear Lake and he decided to try it. He could not catch any crappie and so he switched to bass gear and limited out. Tom Kostik spent three days at Pinecrest Lake and caught just under 100 trout plus a few black bass. All, except for a few for the freezer, were released. George Saksa of Branch 146 fished in Lake Berryessa but, unfortunately, came away empty handed.

In the Bay, a group that included **Lee Clark** of Branch 146 caught ten halibut plus six stripers. **Duane Einhorn** of Branch 146 caught and released two small halibut on a different trip while **Ron Lew** of Branch 146 and **Harry Sherinian** caught both halibut and shark on still another outing.

Tom Kostik and Mike Corker, who fish the Delta nearly every week, continued to catch stripers. However, while

fishing the Spoonbill Bay arm of the Delta, they caught a bevy of catfish. **Paul Dubow**, with two of his sons and three of his grandchildren, fished for stripers not far from where the Sacramento River empties into the Delta and they caught seven keeper stripers and two shakers.

We still have yet to do much ocean fishing, largely because the opening of the salmon season has been delayed until June 26. However, **Phil Scimonelli**, who was on a camping trip near Bodega Bay, decided to do some surf fishing, even though gale conditions prevailed. He was the only fisherman on the beach, but he still enjoyed himself, and he did catch and release a small striper. We are looking forward to fishing on the ocean in the coming months. We have three charter trips planned on the Sundance, a possible trip to the Farallones, and individual trips led by members who have their own boats.

We have resumed our monthly in person breakfast meetings. The next meeting is at 8:30 am on June 24 at the Legends Bar and Grill at Diablo Creek Golf Course, 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord . But many of us assemble earlier, beginning at 7:30 am, for breakfast and story swapping. If you are interested in joining our group, and you can do so even if you have never fished or haven't fished in years, you can just show up, or better yet, contact Big Fish **Ron Lew** at 925-550-4166 or branch fishing chair **Paul Dubow** at 415-495-6504 beforehand and let us know that you are coming.





Five members of our group met online on Monday, May 24. **Mike Farrar** continues as our "Zoom master," which is much

appreciated.. We hope to resume our in-person discussions next month, shortly after the magic date of June 15th.

Our book this month was by Bill Bryson, a pretty prolific writer, and titled *The Body*, a recent best seller. It is subtitled *A Guide for Occupants*. In it, he applies a major research and review effort of the medical field over the years to describe what the various systems in body do to keep us going. There are lots of amazing facts, and some of our group thought that there were too many.

He adds lots of history about how many of the discoveries came about that we take for granted today — many of these were the result of the early practitioners, often working on themselves.

He does add humorous "bits" to help carry the reader through some fairly dry material.

The book is divided into 23 chapters, each describing one of the aforementioned systems that comprise us. There are several pages setting the stage for further analysis, hitting the reader with facts about cells, DNA, the various (59 found in us so far) atomic elements that we need to survive, and it becomes clear that there is a lot more learn and discover how we really work. Partial quote from the book: "That is unquestionably the most astounding thing about us — that we are just a collection of inert components, the same stuff you would find in a pile of dirt. I've said it before in another book, but I believe it's worth repeating: the only think special about the elements that comprise you is that they make you. That is the miracle of life."


The group's recommendation is that if this book could be of interest to a reader; consider choosing the specific parts of the body that may be of interest to you for your study session. I see this as a book for non-medical students, and not for doctors. It does become a bit of a slog as you near the end, and I do mean the end.


