Like the Ladies Day Luncheon in December last year, we will be utilizing Zoom for our special luncheon in May where spouses and significant others are invited along with all the members of Branch 146. We will again set up multiple Breakout Rooms of ten to twelve couples and single Sirs to socialize in this virtual ZOOM environment. In advance, you will submit a request as to who you would like to sit and socialize with. This will be like we do at an actual Ladies Luncheon at Boundary Oak.

Each table (Breakout Room) will be assigned a table leader. We will ask the same table leaders who hosted in December 2020, to again volunteer to lead one or more of the tables this year. It will be their role to invite SIR singles and couples to join them at their table. An optimum table will have five or six couples to promote all around conversation. **Steve Ybarra** has agreed to handle the reservation process which will be as follows:

 Step 1—At your earliest convenience, send an email or call Steve Ybarra, (sjybar@gmail.com, 925.676.7405) letting him know you wish to attend the Ladies Day Luncheon Zoom meeting. List your name and your spouse or partner's name and any other guests you would like to join you at a table. Single SIR members can either join one of these tables or ask to sit at a leaderless table of other single SIR members. Provide email(s) for each person attending including guests. If a table leader has already contacted you to join them, then you just need to confirm with **Steve**, the leader's name, and your email address and that of your guest. **Steve** will assign your table number.

- Step 2—You will receive an invitation to join the Ladies Day Luncheon via Zoom a couple of days before the event. Seating at your table will open on May 13th at 11 am, so you may check in at this time or any time after. The table leaders plan to start discussions at 11:15 am so do not be late.
- Step 3—When you click on the Zoom link, you will enter a waiting room. You will then be let into the main meeting area. Immediately upon being let into the main meeting area, you should rename your picture according to the instructions that will be provided along with the invitation. If you have difficulty, one of the co-hosts ill be able to assist you. Based on the name associated with your picture you will be automatically moved to your assigned room or table.
- Step 4—At 12 noon, we will bring everyone back in to the main room and the Big SIR will welcome you to the Luncheon and provide any announcements prior to the speaker's talk. We expect the speaker will talk 20 to 30 minutes including Q&A. After the speaker is finished, the Song SIRS will sing God Bless America and then the meeting will adjourn.

Consider contacting a sick SIR to offer support and encouragement during his illness. A friendly call is usually welcome. Cards and letters are always appreciated.







One unlucky guy had a flat at the stop. He did not follow the rules we all have: Always carry a patch kit.






come pick him up. A dollar for a kit makes more sense than bothering your Wife. A lesson learned.

SIR Branch 146 photography group teamed up with SIR Branch 8 photography participants on Friday, April 16th, via Zoom. We had roughly 30 participants including one guest that attended the virtual meeting which was outstanding!

Our guest presenter was Sharon Wada who is an outstanding wildlife photographer and an underwater videographer. Sharon presented three segments to her discussion: 1) Seeing Familiar Places with Fresh Eyes. Ms Wada discussed different ways to look at wildlife beyond the norm in these familiar places. Her photos of eagles, otters, seals et al were striking and gorgeous. 2) Dia de Los Muertos in Oaxaca Mexico: A Night at the Comparsa. Our presenter discussed different ways to photograph male models outside a dimly lit church by twisting your body as you are shooting. The result were photos that were eerie but interesting. 3) Dia de Los Muertos in Oaxaca Mexico: The Power of Candlelight. Sharon presented different settings in a graveyard focusing on candles that may be slightly blown out but to capture the overall uniqueness of the people and graves within the picture. In all three segments, our presenter recommended different camera settings for the uniqueness of the situation. If you want to

Our theme for this meeting was "Planes, Trains, and Automobiles" plus other forms of transportation. Our members were encouraged to present current or past photos aligned to this theme. Some of the photographs from Branch 146 shutterbugs are shown below.

Our final segment to our joint meeting was a presentation by **Meng Horng** from Branch 8. His topic was entitled "Photo Editing and Creation." **Meng** discussed composition techniques that went beyond the rule of thirds such as simplification, symmetry, and curved line. Our presenter also discussed the benefits of using a program entitled "ACD See Photo Studio Ultimate 2021." This program presented different ways to be highly creative such as putting yourself into the same photo three different ways.



T. S. Eliot wrote a poem in which he described April as the "cruelest month". That may have been so in the good old days, but April 2021 has been the best fishing month in a long time.

The striper fishing has been terrific. **Karl Droese** led a group of five fisherman fishing the Delta and lower Sacramento that included **Pete Gates** of Branch 146, **Stan Wong, Dick Thomson, Gordon Linebaugh,** and **Ken Fischer.** They came home with eleven keepers, with the largest one at nine pounds that was landed by **Gordon. Brion Beetz** fished farther up the Sacramento, near Colusa, and his group caught eight keepers. **Harry Sherinian** and **Tom Kostik** did not do quite as well because the wind forced them to limit their activity to Spoonville Slough, but they did retrieve one keeper.

San Pablo Reservoir has continued to be productive with rainbow trout. **Romano Gnusti** landed a six- and one-half pounder on one occasion, while **Alan Blavins** took three home for supper on another trip. **Martin Steinpress** of Branch 146 set out on his kayak in the reservoir but returned empty handed. Maybe next time!

Brion Beetz and **Stan Wong** fished the Bay for ocean perch and did very well, catching fish that averaged from two to three pounds. **Brion** also joined a group that sailed out to the Farallons. They caught 35 rockfish and **Brion** added a ling cod to the mix.


Phil Scimonelli continues to be the resident expert on the Pinole Pier. On one trip, he caught both a large halibut and a large striper within one hour of each other.




We continue to consider how to resume our Couples Dining Out activity and are anticipating guidance from our state and Branch 146 leadership about how to do that. Most importantly, of course, is

The SIR 146 Book Group met on-line Monday morning, April 19th, on Zoom. Our Zoom Master continues to be **Mike Farrar**.

We discovered as part of our general discussion that all the members present today are vaccinated for Covid-19.

The discussion also included the recent six-hour PBS series on one of America's best-known authors, Earnest Hemingway. **Paul Dubow** and his wife have been to the Hemingway homes in Key West and near Havana, Cuba. Paul described the life in Cuba as he saw and experienced it (twice). The word I heard most from him was "depressing." The home in Cuba was called a "finca" meaning ranch, and it had great views, he said, along with Hemingway's fishing boat "Pilar," one of his favorite hangouts. His travels there reinforced in my mind the idea that in Communism, some are more equal than others.

We then moved to our "Book of the Month," *The Princess Spy*," by Larry Loftis, who has written several books about the spy business in World War II.

The story is about a young woman from Pearl River, New York, who decides she wants to contribute to the war effort, and through a chance encounter is recruited by an OSS agent to serve in Spain, which at that time was ruled by General Francisco Franco. She is assigned to the US Embassy in Madrid as a "code clerk" in the communications group, with "other duties as assigned."

She begins to make the rounds and meets a lot of the upper crust of society, including the Generalissimo himself, going to bullfights (and is wooed by one of the most famous bull fighters) and to long weekends at the fabulous country homes of some of society. She picks up bits and pieces which are relayed to the appropriate people. All in all, she has a great life.

Larry Loftis is not the first to write about her and the role she had in the war. Others have written on this subject, as she herself did. Much of the criticism of the book is about what may have been made up of her story, both by her and by other writers. It is a little hard to believe.

She does have a couple of close calls, but survives to marry very well and travel post-war Europe with her wealthy new husband. She does continue to work occasionally for the mysterious successor agency to the OSS, which President

Truman shut down, but eventually became the CIA.

Her husband died early, and she inherited a lot of money. As the author put it: "However, her true story needed no embellishment. She's lived an extraordinary multifaceted life as a small-town girl, a model, a spy, a wife, a mother, a socialite, a fashion icon, and a celebrity."


Our group gave it grades ranging from C- to B.
