



Water your lawn in long heavy intervals rather than shallow frequent ones. It is best to water 20 minutes and wait 20 minutes to promote deeper root growth.

POISON CONTROL

If someone in your family swallows something toxic, you can now call a national toll-free hotline: 800-222-1232. It will connect you to the closest Poison Control Center. More than 75% of calls to poison centers can be managed over the phone. Call the center (or your doctor) before you attempt to cause vomiting. Inducing vomiting (with syrup of ipecac, for instance) can be dangerous under some circumstances.

WEIGHT'S EFFECT ON BLOOD PRESSURE

Researchers say controlling weight is one of the keys to controlling blood pressure. Scientists have found that overweight people lowered their blood pressure by one point for every 2.2 pounds they lost. Losing 20 pounds could lower blood pressure by 9 points.

THE PRESSURE'S OFF

It's already a weight loss wonder and a cancer-prevention phenom. Now, new research points to yet another benefit of green tea. In a 10 year study, scientists at Taiwan's National Cheng Kung University found that drinking four ounces of green or oolong tea daily cut the risk of high blood pressure by 46 %, and gulping 20 ounces slashes risk by a whopping 65%.

Researchers believe the amino acid in green tea may help keep pressure low by preventing blood-vessel constriction. Start drinking your tea.

HOW TO TAKE A PILL

Many people believe that if you tilt your head back to swallow a pill, you'll have a better shot at getting the pill down your throat.

But the fact is, this is the least effective way to take a pill. That's because it also allows the pill unguarded access to your windpipe, where it can cut off your air supply. Tilting your head back is what paramedics do to open a blocked airway.

Try this: Take only one pill at a time. An extra-big swallow of liquid will also help things go down a little easier.




