Election of Officers for 2014

The officer nominees introduced at the June lunch and published in the July Sir Call were unanimously elected by voice vote at the August lunch. We have a strong lineup for 2014 and we are grateful for these men stepping up to a leadership role. These incoming officers will be installed at our November luncheon and they will take office effective January 1, 2014.

Change to a Dues Based Financial Structure

As mentioned in this column and announced at the last luncheon, the State Sir Board approved a bylaw change to allow branches the option of charging its members dues or continuing with voluntary contributions. At the August 5th meeting of all Big Sirs, this by-law change was approved. As announced at our August luncheon, your BEC has elected to change the way we fund branch operations by charging our members dues. For the majority of you this is not a big deal since you willingly made your "voluntary" contribution in previous years. However, this change now fairly spreads the branch operations costs to all branch members. Additionally, it eliminates the arm twisting, emails, phone calls, etc that were required in past years. Your current group of officers, as well as previous BEC's, have worked very hard to keep the branch on sound financial footing without a continuous increase in the "voluntary" contribution. It was not long ago that we asked each member for \$25. Last year we asked for only \$18. I am pleased to let you know that in 2014 the member dues will be \$15. The dues will be payable October 1st and will be delinquent December 31st. We will pass out details to all members attending the September luncheon as well as email all members these details. I thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Boundary Oak Clubhouse Renovation

There is not much new to report regarding the upcoming clubhouse renovation. At this time, we are still planning to move to an alternate location in October of 2014. It is most likely the move will be to the Concord Hilton. There is no current estimate as to how long we will be relocated. There are also a few logistical details to be worked out. 

Sid Landman took the coveted award for greatest improvement (5 pts.) in 2nd vs. 1st half, but there was too much makeup to catch the top guns.



Couples Golf



We are expecting a presentation by a representative from AT&T. He will talk about Digital Life, a security product that lets people monitor and manage home security and energy systems from afar using a smartphone, computer, or tablet. AT&T provides and installs Internet-connected cameras, along with sensors on doors and windows, and smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, door locks, thermostats, and moisture sensors. The devices and sensors are all hooked up to a home broadband connection and can be controlled from a computer or mobile device. The Digital Life application is available on most browsers and there are mobile apps for iOS, Android, and Windows Phone devices. Meetings of the Area 2 Computer and Technology Group are held the 3rd Thursday of each month (except June and December) from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., at the Walnut Creek Elks Lodge, 1475 Creekside Drive. Whether you are a beginner or a seasoned user, we try to offer something for everyone. We ask for a donation of \$5 to cover the cost of the hall rental, coffee and cookies, but some months are free, so come and see if September is one of those!



Sir bringing a Guest: Please e-mail also by noon on the Friday prior to the luncheon leaving your name, badge number, and your guest’s name with proper spelling.




