

A request has been sent to the chairmen to make phone calls to their activity members to encourage them to hang in there, and we will be back to normal when this is all over.





AREA 16 Fishing Report Paul Dubow

Last month, we reported that salmon fishing, by and large, had been poor. This month, it rose to the level of inconsistent. All of our outings have been aboard the Sundance, which groups of us charter regularly. The method used

by **R.J. Waldron,** the Sundance captain, to reel and land the fish, is unique and so he is often more successful than other captains. Although that is also the case this year, the catch is definitely less than 2019. They seem to be social distancing from our hooks.

The month actually started well. After some bad reports about the fishing on previous days, a group that included Paul Dubow, Rich Fiscina and Lee Clark of Branch 146 and three others set out with low expectations, but managed to bring home nine keepers, three less than the limit. Two days later, a group led by Bob Stein limited out. But then the bite dropped off again. A group that included **Bob Stein** and **Brion Beetz** caught only two fish. The most fish that the Sundance brought home that week was five. However, Paul **Dubow** continued to ride with Lady Luck and a group that also included Karl Droese, Joe Miscione, Carl Moyer, Dave Rege, and Jack Waddell, came home with a limit that saw Joe catch a lunker on the very first cast. That inspired Paul to try his luck a few days later fishing for halibut on the Kingfish, along with Carl Moyer and Phil Scimonelli. On the day before, the Kingfish, with 14 aboard, caught a limit of 42 halibut. But not on this day. Carl and Phil each managed to catch one fish, while Paul zeroed out. However, that was not the worst fishing outing of the day. The Sundance, with Brion Beetz, Bob Stein, and Gordon Linebaugh aboard, was skunked fishing for salmon. The salmon fishing for the month then ended on a high note as a group consisting of Lee Clark, Karl Droese, Paul Dubow, Gordon Linebaugh, Dick Thomson, and Jack Waddell limited out by 11:30 am.

One of the phenomena of this strange year is the arrival of bluefin tuna not far outside of the Gate. These behemoths are rarely seen around here, but they have been appearing regularly this year and **Ron Lew** of Branch 146 was in a group that hooked one of the big fish, but was unable to land it after a lengthy fight. **Ron** also fished the Delta where he caught both stripers and blackberries. (The latter was on land.)

Tom Kostik, Harry Sherinian, and Mike Corker, who are our Delta experts, again fished that body of water and caught and released many black bass. However, the black bass trophy of the month went to **Mario Moratorio. Mario** has moved to San Juan Capistrano to be closer to his children, but on his final foray on the Delta, he landed a 10 lb. black bass.

Because of the COVID 19 restrictions, we have temporarily suspended our breakfast meetings at the Legends Bar and Grill. Instead, we meet via Zoom on the fourth Thursday of the month, where we share coffee, regale each other with our fish stories good and bad, and plan our future outings, of which there are many. The next meeting is at 8:30 am on September 24. Four members of the SIR 146 On-Line book group met Monday morning, August 10. Our "Zoom Master" was **Walt Busenius**.

Books we have been reading include

Salt, A World History by Mark Kurlansky, some of the series by John Sanford, and *Has Anyone Seen Luis Velez* by Catherine Ryan Hyde.

We moved to our selection for August, *Thunder Below*, the story of the WWII submarine Barb narrated and written by its commander, Eugene Fluckey, during the last years of the war in the Pacific. He stayed in the Navy and retired as a Rear Admiral. He was young, innovative, and aggressive. He had the complete confidence of his commanding Admiral. The Barb held the record for the number of enemy ships sank at 17.

He had a very complete life after leaving the Navy, living in Portugal as an American official, and eventually running an orphanage with his second wife. Portugal gave him their highest decoration to honor him. He also was awarded the US Congressional Medal of Honor for his outstanding accomplishments with the Barb. As President Roosevelt was too ill to do the presentation, it was done by the Secretary of the Navy and the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral King. He asked that to not receive the medal, but to give more recognition to the crew of the Barb. His offer was not accepted.

While he worked the crew hard, he also did his best to take care of them. He managed to acquire a lot of beer whenever the ship was supplied, and always told someone to put several cases in "the cooler" whenever they were about to sink a ship! The cooks also made some great cakes to help celebrate a sinking in an "after action" gathering.

Admiral Fluckey had access to a diary that one of the crew had (illegally) kept, and some of the Japanese military records of events as seen from their point of view. He also made good use of the USN records in Washington D.C.

He reinvented submarine tactics in the prenuclear era, from wait for enemy shipping to come you, to go looking for them, even in and around the Japanese home islands. He and the Barb lived through the changes in torpedo technology, which sometimes worked and sometimes did not, failing to hit the targeted vessels and possibly putting his sub at risk. He acquired the nickname "Luckey Fluckey."

Our statistic for <u>Most Improved Player</u> shows the 2020 winning percentage divided by the 2019 winning percentage or <u>WIN % 2020/2019 Avg</u>. Frank Lucas is 1st with 263% as he won 26% of his games in 2020 and 10% in 2019. 2nd is **Steve Ybarra** with 177%, as he won 25% in 2020 and 14% in 2019. 3rd is **Ray Bland** at 139%, as he won 40% in 2020 and 29% in 2019.

Steve Ybarra leads for <u>most seconds</u> at 26. **Bob West** is 2nd with 22.5, and **Frank Lucas** is 3rd with 20.5.

Our <u>YTD average low score</u> leaders are **Bob Finlayson** with 68.2 points followed by **Ray Bland** with 69.6 points and **Bob West** with 70.1.

I have added a new comparison, dividing the 2020 Avg score by 2019. <u>YTD best improved in scoring average</u> is **Brian McCarthy** who is 80% of his 2019 average. In 2nd is **Frank Lucas** with 84% and 3rd is a tie between **Ray Bland** and **Jim Nelson** both with 92%.

Frank Lucas is the leader in <u>shooting the moon</u> having done it 29 times. **Ray Bland** is 2nd with 26 and **Rich Lyon** 3rd with 14.

<u>YTD STM % of games</u> is total STM divided by games played. In 1st is **Frank Lucas** who "Shoots the Moon" in 38.2% of games played. 2nd is **Ray Bland** with 38% and 3rd is **Jim Nelson** with 35.7%.

Steve Ybarra leads the most games played this year at 77, followed by Frank Lucas at 76 and Ron Polivka at 73.

A new statistic is fewest uncovered passes since July 10th. An uncovered pass is when you pass to someone who shoots the moon. Leading is **Bob West** with 0, 2nd is **Bob Finlayson** with 1 and **Steve Ybarra** is 3rd with 2.





There is a tremendous amount of television programming available beyond your standard cable or satellite service. Numerous interesting documentaries, Academy Award movies, classic movies, TV series, etc. are available via Internet streaming. In addition, some of these services are free.
