


Bowling Larry Mitchell

Sturgeon fishing, which has been great this year, turned sour this month. The problem was caused by the heavy rain which poured fresh water into the delta and drove the sturgeon to the bottom. **Carl Moyer, Sal Costanza, Richard Bennett, Ron Yates, and Mario Moratario** all tried their luck without success. But we are sure that the sturgeon fishing will get better as the year progresses. Trout fishing at Shadow Cliffs Reservoir was equally bleak. But there were two exceptions. **John O'Brien, Carl Moyer, and Paul Dubow** nearly limited out on a beautiful sunny day. The catch included two thunder trout, including a six pounder bagged by **Carl**. Thunder trout are in the rainbow family and have been recently planted at Shadow Cliffs. They differ from rainbows in that they have a brilliant orange streak rather than the red streak sported by rainbows. On another occasion, **Carl and John**, along with **Terry Miller**, struggled to catch two rainbows but **Harry Sherinian**, denied room in **Carl's** boat, picked up three rainbows from shore in just an hour. In another foray, **Joe Miscione**, fishing with three friends, landed a fifteen pound striper in Los Vaqueros reservoir. **Joe Karg** tested the salmon fishing in Bodega Bay but apparently was a day too soon. He didn't pick up any fish and on the next day, anglers on the same boat limited out. But **Joe's** trip was not for naught. He brought home a limit of Dungeness crabs. While the fishing this month was at best spotty, the eating was terrific, 27 of us journeyed to **Carl Moyer's** home for a fish fry. We consumed 17 pounds of delicious rock cod and other goodies, including cioppino prepared by Chef **Joe Miscione**. Branch 146 members who attended were **Gene Schulting, Reggie Fromm, Al Meier and Paul Dubow**.

We will be very busy this spring with delta fishing for bass, catfish, stripers and sturgeon, trout fishing at Shadow Cliffs and Los Vaqueros, party boat trips for halibut, a trip to Lake Oroville for king salmon, and what looks like a promising salmon season in the ocean. 
