

John Pearl





We learned that **Charlie Chaplin** made five movies here, including *The Tramp*, one of his best known works. This museum also houses the short film seen on *60 Minutes* that shows San Francisco's Market Street just days before the 1906 earthquake. 



## FISHING REPORT PAUL DUBOW



Last month, Mexico was a popular destination for our group. First, **Karl Droese, Romano Gnusti, Rich Bal, Ed Dijkman, Rick Fend, Bill Landers** and **Gene Bell** ventured to Buena Vista on the Baja peninsula and landed yellowfin tuna, marlin, and wahoo. **Ed** caught the largest fish, a 57 lb. wahoo. Shortly thereafter, **Paul Dubow, Norm Moriguchi,** and **Ray Chow** traveled to **Los Barilles**, just north of Buena Vista. Most of their catch were yellowfin tuna, ranging from 35 to 62 lbs. **Paul** also caught and released an 80 lb sailfish, but **Ray** outdid him by catching and releasing two of the billfish, also in the 80 lb range. **Bill Landers** continued his excellent black bass fishing in the delta, as he and **Joe Miscione** caught and released about 40 of the feisty fighters on one trip. The kokanee continued to bite in Lake Berryessa, to the enjoyment of **George Schulze, Ron Yates,** and **Rich Bennet**, who picked up 16 of the fish, running from 15 to 18 inches long. **Mike Corker** and **Terry Miller** fished Montezuma Slough for sturgeon and **Terry** hooked but lost a large one. **Joe Miscione** went to the same venue for stripers but returned only with catfish. The ocean also drew the attention of some of our anglers. **Joe Karg** caught a keeper salmon on a party boat. **Carl Moyer, Dick Thomson,** and **Harry Sherinian** made a number of trips on Carl's boat. Each time, they limited out on rockfish and also averaged from two to four ling cod per trip. In addition, **Harry** boated an 18 lb halibut and **Carl** caught an 8 lb salmon.

We will be very busy this fall with delta fishing for bass, catfish, and sturgeon, party boat trips for kokanee, sturgeon, rockfish, and salmon, outings on the Klamath and Sacramento Rivers for salmon, and another outing on Lake Davis for trout.

Our next meeting is on Thursday, October 27, at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. The meeting starts at 8:30 am, but join us for breakfast at 8 am. Our speaker will be **Dick Poole**, a legend in Bay Area trolling innovations.
