



Wide World of Books Terry Marchione



This month I'm recommending a book which will definitely appeal to the golfers in our group but non-golfers should enjoy it as well since it is as much a story about life as it is about golf. Since I purchased this book on my Kindle, the Book Exchange does not have a copy (as far as I know). However, I know that at least one member of our group has a copy.

Regarding the Kindle, I have had some fellow SIRs' mentioned they have read reviews of the device which pointed out some shortcomings. Trust me—the positives far outweigh the negatives. Mostly it has to do with the placement of the controls on the device. I suspect the next generation of the device will address these issues but there is no need to wait.

The Match:

In 1956, millionaires **Eddie Lowery** and **George Coleman** made an off-the-cuff bet on a golf match and inadvertently set up one of the sport's most climactic duels; this one casual game has become the sport's great suburban legend. Frost (*The Greatest Game Ever Played*) diligently covers the two pros slightly past their prime, **Ben Hogan** and **Byron Nelson**, who squared off against two top amateurs, **Harvie Ward** and **Ken Venturi**. It happened in the last hours of **Hogan's** playing career, and ten years after **Byron** had left the stage, but at the near pinnacle of the amateurs', whose personalities couldn't have been more diametrically opposed (**Venturi** the classic up-and-comer, and **Ward** the inveterate playboy who performed hung over on two hours' sleep). The match itself, scrupulously teased out by **Frost** for maximum drama, is less interesting than the people involved and the historical backdrop. The match happened near the sport's great cusp, as it transitioned from something for amateurs to a professional career, from a pastime for wastrel aristocrats and entertainers (and **Bing Crosby**, with his annual booze-soaked Clambake charity matches) to a mainstream suburban obsession. **Frost** has a penchant toward the florid, but as he writes, because he was **Ben Hogan**, and it was just past twilight, and his like would never pass this way again, he captures an elusive magic in this improbable matchup and what it meant for those who played and witnessed it.

Photoshop Elements 6 Program

To a beginner, Photoshop Elements is a relatively complex digital photography program and learning it can be daunting. **Rich Ahlf** is now teaching only aspects of PE 6 that SIR students want to learn. For example, how do you get pictures from your camera or a CD onto your computer so that you can do things to them with the Photoshop Elements 6 program? How do you send pictures via email?
